Mike Cornner's Fantasy Golf Trip--Scotland 2018--Part Two--The Courses

We arrived and our excitement couldn't be higher. First off, we headed aboutas far north as you can go in Scotland to play Royal Dornoch Championship Course. The great Herbert Warren Wind once wrote, "No golfer has completed his education unless he's played and studied Royal Dornoch." In the 400 years that the game has been played at Royal Dornoch, golfers far and wide have made the pilgrimage to this village on equal latitude with the Bering Sea. It's a spellbinding experience that rewards strategy over power, while testing the most proficient short game around with its famous domed greens. We gave thanks to the native son and former Keeper of the Green, Donald Ross. The weather was cold and windy, in other words perfect weather for golf or as they say if it's not wet and not windy, it's not really golf.

After a night's rest, we moved onto Castle Stuart Golf Links. After his overwhelming success of Kingsbarns, developer Mark Passinen found his encore in The Highlands on a stretch of property adjacent the Moray Firth. The course embraces a degree of playability not often found on links courses in Scotland with wide fairways and large green complexes being the order of the day. The result is a course that is both visually stunning and a delight to the average golfer (not that anyone in our club is an average golfer). However, it's demanding enough to host the world's best when it is called upon to host the Scottish Open.

We left Inverness the next day on our way to St. Andrews. Along the way there is the Culloden Battlefield where the Scots were demolished by the precision of the English forces. Of course, we stopped by Loch Ness where there are plenty of souvenir stands.

At last, we were in St. Andrews. We stayed at the Old Course Hotel. Our room overlooked the Old Course and the attendant who helped us with our luggage was completely outfitted in plaid and kilt. Can you believe a 9:30 tee time? We were actually there. You are staying on the first tee with visions of the Open Championship dancing in your head. Some say that the Old Course was not designed by man but simply evolved over time thanks to Mother Nature.

Yet throughout the links we encounter the influence of the longtime Keeper of the Green, Old Tom Morris. Behind you at the tee is the Royal and Ancient clubhouse and the British Museum of Golf. We played the double greens with one green stretching almost 100 yards across. Walkers are welcome on the course, so you see couples, parents with children and folks walking their dogs. Apparently errant shots are not a problem for the Scots. Near the end you drive the ball over the corner of our hotel and head to Swilcan Bridge for the traditional photo. You have experienced the magic of the Home of Golf. Everything in St. Andrews is about golf. The shops, pubs and hotels welcome golfers from far and wide. Being there is the experience of a lifetime.

The next day we played The Jubilee Course at St. Andrews. The course runs alongside the Old Course. It's named in honor of Queen Victoria's 75th birthday. It opened in 1897. The locals believe "The Jube" is the hardest course in St. Andrews. That night at dinner in an eatery in town, we had a waiter who asked if we had played that day. We said we had played The Jube. He immediately responded loudly, "I hate The Jube!" We laughed and added that we hated The Jube too.

Four courses down and three to go.

As mentioned in the December <u>Niblick</u>, I had to wait for my mentor, AndyCordova, to graduate to become Captain and #1 on the Monroe High School golf team--coached by our own <u>Niblick</u> Editor, Steve Greenbaum. "Back in the day" our home course was Knollwood GC, and you could play for 50 cents after 3 PM! Knollwood was hyped to be the "Premier Country Club" in the bedroom community of the San Fernando Valley in the 1950's, including notables of the "Rat Pack." One of the celebrities to move in early was the singer, Jimmie Rodgers (one of his hits was 'Honeycomb') on the 9th hole close near the green.

During one of our team practice rounds at Knollwood in 1963 on the par 3, 8th, in a light drizzle in the dusk, I skulled my iron shot (don't rememberwhat club) towards the green. Due to the hole being uphill, we didn't see where it ended up, so we started looking in the traps and over the green since the shot wascoming in "hot." Without any success, we checked the hole and found my ball in the cup for my first of 2-lifetime holes-in-one!

We finished the 9thin the dark and went into the pro shop to register my good luck. At that time, golf ball company promotions included mounting your ball on a trophy and a case of beer! Needless to say, I wasn't eligible for the beer, so I went out to my bag toget my lucky ball. Unfortunately, it wasn't a major brand and scuffed up, so the best we could do amongst the four of us was a Maxfli Dunlap "5" with a couple of cuts (see the enclosed photo) that remains my memory of an old ball in bad weather and a poor shot that I never saw.


